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PIANO JAZZ PHENOMENON TAMMY HALL SEEKS TO HEAL ON NEW ALBUM, "REJUVE"

**All-Original Music To Comfort, Inspire and Encourage;

NEW YORK – Following the successes of her *Blue Divine* album and corresponding *Reflections* DVD, both of which have made the short list for the 2007 Grammy® nomination (*Best New Artist; Best Jazz Instrumental Album; Best Jazz Instrumental Solo; Best Long Form Music Video; Best Short Form Music Video*), jazz star Tammy Hall has opted for a follow-up release that gives back to her listeners. "REJUVE" carries us away to a place of peace right from the opening track, "The Awesome Moment," through to the closing song, "Gratitude." Using a piano tuned in "well temperament," along with violin and percussion, "REJUVE" has especially harmonious melodies creating an overall sound that accomplishes the goal of its title.

Hall, in conjunction with the Elfenworks Foundation and elfenworks, LLC, is joining with the Northern California Division of The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society in an effort to distribute "REJUVE" to those affected by these diseases. Having lost her mother to leukemia as a baby, it is a cause close to her heart, and Hall is more than passionate about sharing this healing music: "*You know, my mother, Tommie Faye Hall, died at 19 of leukemia. She was a pianist too, and had better treatment been available she might have lived to realize her musical dreams,*" says Hall, "*REJUVE is inspired by her on many levels, and it fulfils a dream I've had to do something to bring more attention to the fight against cancers – leukemia in particular.*"
